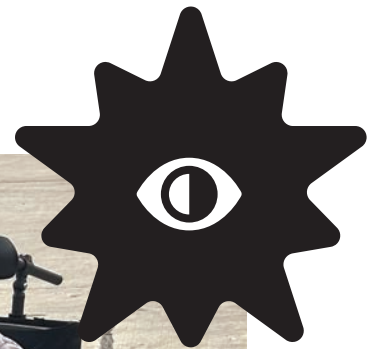

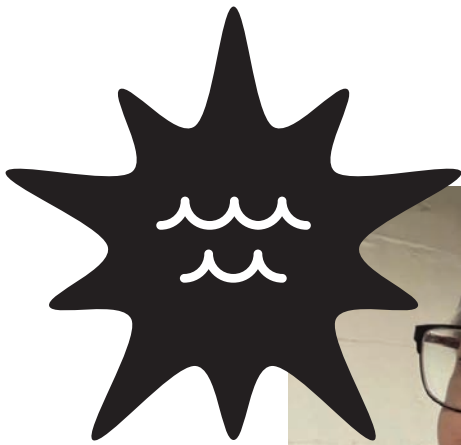

Finding Confidence & Freedom

Rondae was diagnosed with Retinitis Pigmentosa 20 years ago, followed by a macular hole that took the vision in her right eye. As her sight declined, so did her mental health, income, and housing. She went from self-employed to unemployed, from homeowner to living in someone else's basement, all while raising her kids and, later, her grandkids.

Unsure of the future, Rondae walked through the doors at Outlook and found more than just training. She found a path forward. "With RP, you are kind of in a constant state of grieving," she said. "Sometimes that can be overwhelming and stop the learning process."

She's now embracing everything Outlook has to offer: peer support, adaptive tech training, and community events. Learning JAWS is helping her pursue her dream of writing a book. She's even attended White Cane Day and brought her grandkids to Outlook's family ice skating event. These moments reminded her she's not alone on this journey.

With renewed hope and growing independence, Rondae is looking ahead, imagining travel, mentoring others, and showing her grandkids what it means to thrive.
